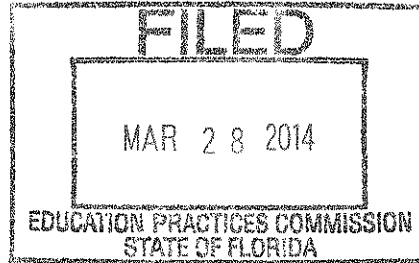

Final Order

Respondent, Janet Christine Barr, holds Florida educator's certificate no. 1058283. Petitioner has filed an Administrative Complaint seeking suspension, revocation, permanent revocation or other disciplinary action against the certificate. A copy of the Administrative Complaint is attached to and made a part of this Order.

This cause came before a teacher panel of the Education Practices Commission on February 28, 2014, in Gainesville, Florida.

Respondent has chosen not to dispute the allegations of the Administrative Complaint and has requested an informal hearing to present evidence and testimony in mitigation. Respondent was present.

Paragraphs 1 through 3 of the Administrative Complaint were adopted by the Education Practices Commission as its findings of fact. Counts 1 through 3 of the Administrative Complaint were adopted by the Education Practices Commission as its conclusions of law.

Upon consideration, it is ORDERED that:

1. Respondent's Florida educator's certificate is hereby suspended for a period of 2 years from the date of this Final Order.

2. Upon employment in any public or private position requiring a Florida educator's certificate, Respondent shall be placed on 2 employment years of probation with the conditions that during that period, (s)he shall:

A. Immediately notify the investigative office in the Department of Education upon employment or termination of employment in the state in any public or private position requiring a Florida educator's certificate.

B. Have Respondent's immediate supervisor submit annual performance reports to the investigative office in the Department of Education.

C. Pay to the Commission during the first 6 months of each probation year the administrative costs (\$150) of monitoring probation assessed to the educator.

D. Violate no law and shall fully comply with all district school board policies, school rules, and State Board of Education rules.

E. Satisfactorily perform all assigned duties in a competent, professional manner.

F. Bear all costs of complying with the terms of a final order entered by the Commission.

G. Refrain from transporting minor students in or on motor vehicles.

H. Provide a certified college transcript to verify successful (a grade of "pass" or a letter grade no lower than a "B") completion of 3 hours of college level course-work in the

area(s) of Ethics within the first year of probation, which may be taken online.


I. Respondent is assessed an administrative fine of \$500.00 to be paid within one year from the date of this Final Order.

3. As part of the Recovery Network Program the Respondent shall submit to a psychological evaluation.

4. The Respondent shall submit to a Substance Abuse Evaluation relating to the issues cited in the Notice of Reasons as determined by the RNP and conducted by an RNP approved licensed provider and undergo any counseling or treatment as may be prescribed by said professional. Respondent shall provide the RNP written verification from the treatment provider(s) of successful completion of the evaluation within sixty (60) days of issuance of the Final Order OR within sixty (60) days of the initial date of employment in a position requiring a Florida educator's certificate, whichever occurs later.

This order shall become effective upon filing with the Clerk of the Commission.



REVIEW PROCEEDINGS ARE GOVERNED BY THE FLORIDA RULES OF APPELLATE PROCEDURE. SUCH PROCEEDINGS ARE COMMENCED BY FILING ONE COPY OF A NOTICE OF APPEAL WITH THE EDUCATION PRACTICES COMMISSION AND A SECOND COPY, ACCOMPANIED BY FILING FEES PRESCRIBED BY LAW, WITH THE DISTRICT COURT OF APPEAL, FIRST DISTRICT, OR WITH THE DISTRICT COURT OF APPEAL IN THE APPELLATE DISTRICT WHERE THE PARTY RESIDES. THE NOTICE OF APPEAL MUST BE FILED WITHIN THIRTY (30) DAYS OF RENDITION OF THIS ORDER.
