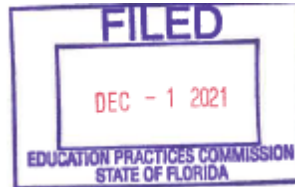

Final Order

This matter appeared before the Education Practices Commission ("Commission") at a duly-noticed public meeting, on October 27, 2021, in Tallahassee, Florida, for a hearing not involving disputed issues of material fact pursuant to Respondent's Election of Rights requesting a hearing pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57(2), Florida Statutes. Petitioner has filed an Administrative Complaint seeking disciplinary action against the Respondent. A copy of the Administrative Complaint is attached to and made a part of this Final Order. Respondent was neither present nor represented by counsel.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Commission adopts as its finding of facts the facts alleged in the Administrative Complaint.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based upon the Findings of Fact, the Commission concludes the Respondent has violated section 1012.795(1)(j), Florida Statutes and rule 6A-10.081(2)(a)1, Florida Administrative Code.

The Commission is empowered by Sections 1012.795(1) and 1012.796(7), Florida Statutes, to impose a penalty against the Respondent.

Therefore, it is ORDERED that:

1. Respondent is issued a letter of reprimand.
2. Respondent is assessed an administrative fine of \$750.00 to be paid within the probationary period.
3. Upon employment in any public or private position requiring a Florida educator's certificate, Educator shall be placed on 2 employment years of probation with the standard conditions, the Respondent shall:
 - A. Immediately notify the investigative office in the Department of Education (DOE) upon employment or termination of employment in the state in any public or private position requiring a Florida educator's certificate.
 - B. Have his or her immediate supervisor submit annual performance reports to the investigative office in the DOE.
 - C. Pay to the commission within the first 6 months of each probation year and administrative costs (\$150) of monitoring probation assessed to the Educator.
 - D. Violate no law and shall fully comply with all district school board policies, school rules, and State Board of Education rules.
 - E. Satisfactorily perform his or her assigned duties in a competent,

professional manner.

F. Bear all costs of complying with the terms of a Final Order entered by the commission.

G. Complete **one** of the following:

1. Educator shall provide a certified college transcript verifying completion with a grade of "B" or higher of three (3) credit hours of college level course work in the areas of Classroom Management within 2 years of probation.


Or

2. Educator shall complete 2 NEA Courses in the area of Classroom Management and provide documentation verifying successful completion to the investigative office in the DOE within 2 years of probation.

4. Limit scope of practice to not serving as a Teacher or Teacher's Assistant in a classroom with Exceptional Student Education (ESE) students during the probation period.

This order shall become effective upon filing with the Clerk of the Commission.



SUCH PROCEEDINGS ARE COMMENCED BY FILING ONE COPY OF A NOTICE OF APPEAL WITH THE EDUCATION PRACTICES COMMISSION AND A SECOND COPY, ACCOMPANIED BY FILING FEES PRESCRIBED BY LAW, WITH THE DISTRICT COURT OF APPEAL, FIRST DISTRICT, OR WITH THE DISTRICT COURT OF APPEAL IN THE APPELLATE DISTRICT WHERE THE PARTY RESIDES. THE NOTICE OF APPEAL MUST BE FILED WITHIN THIRTY (30) DAYS OF RENDITION OF THIS ORDER.

ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLAINT

Petitioner, Richard Corcoran, as Commissioner of Education, files this Administrative Complaint against LILLIAN D. BORDON. The Petitioner seeks the appropriate disciplinary sanction of the Respondent's educator's certificate pursuant to sections 1012.315, 1012.795, and 1012.796, Florida Statutes, and pursuant to Rule 6A-10.081, Florida Administrative Code, Principles of Professional Conduct for the Education Profession in Florida, said sanctions specifically set forth in sections 1012.795(1) and 1012.796(7), Florida Statutes.

The Petitioner alleges:

JURISDICTION

1. The Respondent holds Florida Educator's Certificate 1198164, covering the areas of Autism Spectrum Disorders, Elementary Education, English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL), Exceptional Student Education (ESE) and Prekindergarten/Primary Education, which is valid through June 30, 2022.

2. At all times pertinent hereto, the Respondent was employed as a Pre-Kindergarten ESE Teacher at Jupiter Elementary School in the Brevard County School District.

MATERIAL ALLEGATIONS

3. On or about January 29, 2020, Respondent failed to supervise [REDACTED], a three-year-old female Exceptional Student Education student, when she left her alone in the classroom, for several minutes, during a fire drill.

4. During the 2018-2019 school year, Respondent failed to supervise students on multiple occasions.

The Petitioner charges:

STATUTE VIOLATIONS

COUNT 1: The Respondent is in violation of section 1012.795(1)(j), Florida Statutes, in that Respondent has violated the Principles of Professional Conduct for the Education Profession prescribed by State Board of Education rules.

RULE VIOLATIONS

COUNT 2: The allegations of misconduct set forth herein are in violation of Rule 6A-10.081(2)(a)1, Florida Administrative Code, in that Respondent has failed to make reasonable effort to protect the student from conditions harmful to learning and/or to the student's mental health and/or physical health and/or safety.

WHEREFORE, based on the reasons set forth herein and in accordance with the Explanation of Rights and Election of Rights forms attached to and made a part of this Administrative Complaint, Petitioner respectfully recommends that the Education Practices Commission impose an appropriate sanction against the Respondent's educator's certificate pursuant to the authority provided in sections 1012.795(1) and 1012.796(7), Florida Statutes. The sanctions imposed by the Education Practices Commission may include, but are not limited to, any one or a combination of the following: issuing the Respondent a written reprimand; placing the Respondent on probation for any period of time; restricting the Respondent's authorized scope of practice; assessing the Respondent an administrative fine; directing the Respondent to enroll in the Recovery Network Program; suspending the Respondent's educator's certificate for a period of time not to exceed five years; revoking the Respondent's educator's certificate for a period of time up to 10 years or permanently; determining the Respondent to be ineligible for certification; or barring the Respondent from reapplying for an educator's certificate for a period of time up to 10 years or permanently.

As you know, a teacher hearing panel of the Florida Education Practices Commission reviewed the matter pending against you in its entirety. The panel concluded during a public hearing that you violated the Principles of Professional Conduct for the Education Profession in Florida prescribed by the State Board of Education rules and hereby reprimands you for the conduct alleged in the Administrative Complaint, which is incorporated herein.
